










PBS member station, PBS Reno, serving northern






Have you ever been to Machu Picchu?

It is also a wonder of the modern world.




The geographic location is nearby holy mountains, but in the middle of a tropical rainforest.

The wonder I have is Machu Picchu and it is estimated that it was built around the year 1450.


Archeologists believe that the sight might have been royal estate for leaders of the Inca Empire.

people that moved large stones.




It was considered a wonder
